



Username & Passwords

Having a hard time remembering your usernames and passwords? Check this list to see how to log into different sites.

MOST sites use the username 26lastnamefirstinitial (example: 26McCartneyS), although some will use a "long username" with your WHOLE first name (26McCartneyStacy)

Passwords: MOST passwords use your Student ID number somewhere in them. This is a 9-digit number that starts with 226 and ends with 650. The numbers in the middle are different for each student (example: 226123650). Sometimes you might have to add the letters mcm to the end of the number. PowerSchool & your school Google account will both use the password you made up at the beginning of the school year.
